






Where do you want to ride too !!!



This means that only one person per couple (your choice) will get up to exchange one gift.


Of course, the single person will still get up to exchange their one gift.

Mt Whitney Portal Ride Ahhh correction Kernville Ride......

What a bummer -- the Mt Whitney Portals breakfast ride is one of the group's favorite rides of the year and always has good participation. With everyone keyed up for a ride to cooler climes our plans were literally rained on as Randy and Kim Geiger broke the news late the evening before that our plans had to change. The summer snow melt, coupled with monsoonal thunderstorms dumped torrents of rain in the mountains, caused Lone Pine creek to overflow its banks. Heavy flooding not only closed the Portals store and campgrounds, but potentially compromised the road itself. Given that information, plans were made for an alternate ride to Cheryl's in Kernville and emails were sent out to the membership notifying people of the changes at hand.

I was extremely pleased to see the large turnout as I rolled into Inyokern. All gassed up, a few minutes of chit-chat and a quick ride brief and 14 bikes with 19 riders rolled out for Cheryl's and breakfast.

We arrived at Cheryl's without mishap to find it packed. We collected in small groups both inside and out and went about enjoying breakfast with good friends both old and new. After our meal we splintered into groups and singles and made our way back home. I personally clocked 126 miles, but I know that several others didn't make the Inyokern turnoff on Hwy 14 and rode on North. If you take my miles and multiply by the number of bikes, we scored a minimum of 1764 miles.

Paul & Crystal's Sturgis Adventure!!

First we want to thank Bland & Billee for trailering Crystal's bike to their cabin in Wyoming, allowing us to stay at their cabin and just being great friends.

For the trip, we bought cooling vests and mesh vests for the hot portions of the trip. Plus I bought a tire inflator that plugs into the cigarette lighter, which came in handy. I had a new front tire put on before leaving, and figured the back had a couple thousand miles left on it. I was wrong, but only by ½.

We left Ridgecrest around 8 am and headed out thru Trona to Beatty. Just North of Trona, a Detour sign! Sending us onto the dirt service road around some road work! Nice start to a 1400 mile journey! That lasted for about 1.5 miles, then back onto the paved road and on to Beatty for gas. Then it was on to Las Vegas and another gas stop and lunch. Hot? In Vegas? In August? Nah, only felt like 120 degrees, was probably 113. Gassed up and on to St. George, Utah to spend the night. But first, THE POOL! AAHH.!!!!

The next day we headed for Grand Junction, Colorado. About 5 miles North of St. George we rode upon a truck towing a trailer loaded with crap. The trailer started swaying and the crap started moving around on the trailer. I backed off waiting for the crap to hit the fan. Sure enough, a piece of plywood wiggled free from the rest of the crap and slide off onto the I15. Thankfully, it slid off to the side of the road. I got around the crap hauling truck and never looked back. We stopped at the view areas in Utah for pictures and breaks, then coasted on into Grand Junction and again, THE POOL.

Saturday we headed for Boulder to spend the weekend with my daughter. Except for the temperature going from around 80 in Grand Junction to the low 60's at the Eisenhower tunnel, no issues to report.

I checked my rear tire on Sunday and noticed my 2K estimate was off by about 1k. I called the HD shop in Cheyenne, Wyoming and was told they opened at 9 am, and it was 1st come 1st serve. We left Boulder on Monday, hoping to be at the Burchett cabin before dark. Made it to Cheyenne, found the shop and was 3rd in line. 3 HOURS later, we were finally on the road with a new rear tire. But we made it to the cabin around 630 pm. We only encountered 3 little rain showers along the way.

Tuesday looked to be a lost day for a trip to Devil's Tower. Dark clouds overhead, but no rain as of yet. So the 4 of us, (Bland, Billee, Crystal & myself) decided to go for it. A couple of miles onto the I90, the flood gates opened, hard, driving rain. We pulled over to one the Interstate parking areas, Bland & Billee put on their rain gear, Cris & I had none, so we had to tough it out. Back on the road, another 8 miles to Moorcroft for gas, the rain stopped, the sky started to clear. On to Devil's Tower!

What can I say about Devil's Tower? It is AWESOME! I want to go again when it's NOT bike week and get the true experience. That week, too many bikes, cars, trucks, RV's. But it was still great to experience.

Next we were off to the Buffalo Chip campground as Cris & I had tickets for that night's Poison/Toby Keith concert. Bland led us around to the North side of Sturgis and the Chip's entrance. That's where we parted ways for the evening as Cris & were camping(?) (really?) at the Chip as the concert didn't end until midnight.

The concert was great, but camping? With thousands of other bikers? Outside? In a tent? Let's just say it's a good thing I can get by for awhile with a small amount of sleep. I'm not sure what time the parties (yes, parties) ended, but with music from all sides, drunks staggering by the tent, bikers revving their engines, I may have finally dozed off around 3 am.

We got up about 6 am, loaded the bike, and headed for the cabin. After showering, we dusted off Cris's "cute" bike so she could ride that day. Bland lead us to Hewlet for "No Panties Wednesday". Now, Hewlet is about the size of Inyokern, and we got there around 1030 am or so and there was already close to a thousand bikes in town. We stayed a couple of hours walking around and the bikes just kept coming into town. By the time we left, the number of bikes had more than doubled. As we headed toward Bell Fourshe, we saw probably close to 2 thousand more bikes heading towards Hewlet. But the ride to Bell Fourshe was great, until, yup, you guessed it. Bland got a flat. You may have seen the pics on FB. To save the day, a ranch hand working nearby came over and lent a hand. He had plugs, I had my new tire inflator, and we were back on the road.

We stopped for gas, Bland for more air, then onto the Full Throttle Saloon. Thursday, a no motorcycle day. Sore rear ends, AAHH FTS bikini's, oops, I'm doing it again.


Friday, headed back to Boulder to spend the weekend with my daughter.
